

INVESTING FUNDS

The Blood Center Foundation of the Inland Northwest is honored to invest in our region through grants and scholarships. A sample of our support:

Education

• \$26,000 for Medical Laboratory Science student scholarships in the Department of Laboratory Medicine at Providence Sacred Heart Medical Center and Children's Hospital.

Technology

• \$16,890 for the purchase of ten **Automated External Defibrillators** (AED's) from the Blood Center Foundation and \$700 for first aid/ CPR/AED training from the Jean Merrill Education Fund. AED's have been placed at INBC "brick and mortar" locations in Spokane, Moses

CAPITAL SUPPORT

Inland Northwest Blood Center is the only supplier of blood products to more than 35 hospitals and medical facilities in eastern Washington and north Idaho. Hosted by INBC staff transported on five bloodmobiles, we rely on rural blood drives to receive an average of 200 collections each day,

2014 INBC Bloodmobile Impact:

- Over 50% of blood collected came from rural community blood drives.
- Five bloodmobiles traveled over 100.000 miles in 2014.
- Of the 48.751 red blood cell units collected, 25,550 were collected at bloodmobile drives.
- 790 blood drives were held in Washington.
- 304 blood drives were held in Idaho.
